

EXHIBITION REGULATION

1

Exhibitors must be members of an association associated with FOI or COM and must have paid 2009's subscription and not be disqualified. The subscription's request gives automatic and explicit consent to SOR to use personal information in the organizing operations. In particular, subscription's request allows SOR to include in the award book names, address and Rna of the exhibitors.

Breeds allowed in the exhibition:

Colour Bred Canaries
Type Canaries
I.E.I. - Hybrid, exotic, native
Psittacide
Singing Canaries

3

Birds admitted in the contest from the following breeds:

Class A: young animals 2009 from own breeding with FOI/COM irremovable ring. For the regulation about I.E.I. and PSITTACIDE see rules about the awarding of prizes.

Class B: for ringed birds more older or not from own breeding

On booking, for all birds, exhibitors must declare breed, kind, variety, category and code.

5

All cages will be supplied by SOR, with the exception of those for Singing Canaries

6

Birds will be fed by breeders/exhibitors during caging operations. Afterwards SOR will feed them

7

Cages will be plumbed by the exhibitors

8

Moving or tampering cages after they're plumbed is strictly prohibited. Plumbs can be taken off the cages only in case of true emergency and only by the organizing committee.

9

Removing judges cards by the cages is strictly prohibited.

10

Uncaging operations will start on 2009 November 22nd at 5,30 PM. In order to protect the breeders, exhibitors are strongly recommended to strictly comply with this rule. SOR will be enabled to not allow entrance in next exhibitions all exhibitors breaking rules number 8, 9 and 10.

SOR can't be held responsible in case of theft, death or damages to animals subscribed to the awards in the exhibition. A night security service has been organized inside the pavilions.

The organizing committee can check the rings during the judgment operations. Even though made by experts using special equipment, ring checking operations may be dangerous and cause damages to the birds. SOR and the organizing committee can't be held responsible in case of damages.

Market's caging operations will start on November 21nd at 8 AM. Bookings will be considered valid until November 22nd at 10 AM. SOR will be then free to use the areas and no refund will be given. Exhibitors must remember that every cage can contain maximum 6 birds. All birds are allowed to get in from the North Fair Entrance only.

Due to the sanitary laws, the organizing committee is allowed to take excrements samples from the cages to make sanitary investigations. In exhibitions and market, exhibitors must have Mod. 4 (pink form) filled in every field, otherwise they won't be allowed entrance. The Mod. 4 and the Internationale Animal Health Certificate must be shown to the veterinary at the entrance. All birds must enter in fair- pavilions only from North Side of the fairgrounds.

Complying with the COM regulations, the jury will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes writing down the decision on the judgment card. The decision is final.

The exhibition is a big chance to promote ornithology, so:

Subscription's request explicitly allows SOR to film and take pictures of subjects, animals in their environment, products and equipments and use them to promote a positive image of breeders and ornithology.

Operators who want to film or photograph manipulated animals must previously request a written permission. In no way SOR will allow any action that can harm the animals.

For everything not specifically explained in the previous rules, exhibitors must comply with the general exhibition regulation.

In order to make a claim, appliers must ask the Exhibition's Secretary within Saturday 21nd November 2009 at 6 PM under payment of 50 euros
